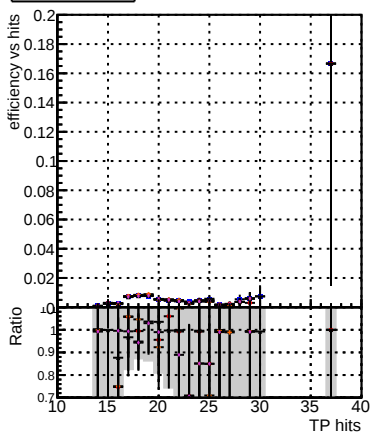
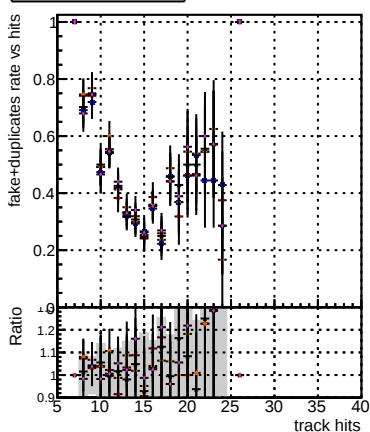


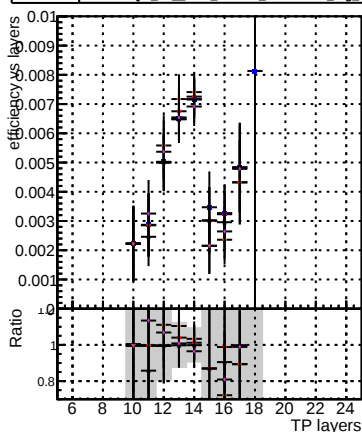

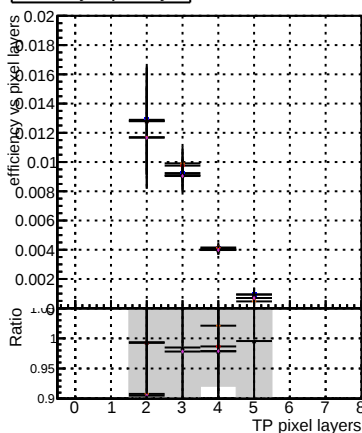

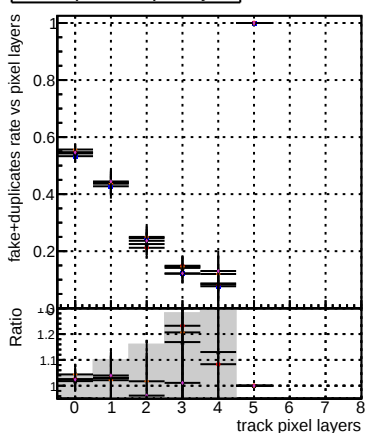

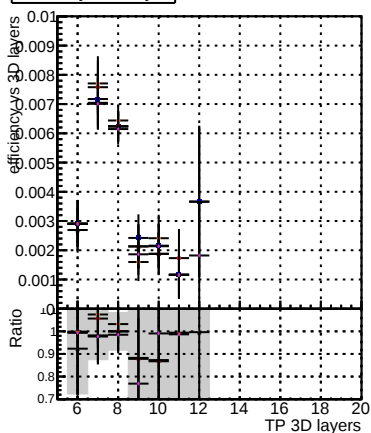
Efficiency vs pixel layer
